Pick Up After Your Pooch

The City of Melville Ranger Services has received numerous complaints about dog faeces in parks and public road verges.

These faeces can cause major health problems to the community through bacterial and parasitic diseases.

Faeces litter can also pose problems for the City of Melville staff as they attempt to brushcutter around trees, shrubs and light poles.

Special dog excreta bins with plastic pooch pouches attached have been provided at over 200 locations on foreshores and reserves within the City for disposal of dog excreta.

All dog owners should be aware of the bins and use them out of courtesy for the health and safety of their fellow residents.

Dog owners are required to pick up after their dogs during exercise times on public land or face a \$100 on-the-spot fine.
