Underground Power – Public Comment

Following the State Government announcement of the conversion to underground power in the Attadale North and Ardross West areas, Western Power is currently determining the location of ground mounted transformer and switchgear units, essential for the management of power distribution in the new system.

This equipment will be located where possible, in parks, public open space, road reserves or in side verges where the system design allows.

Residents are welcome to comment on the proposed positions of the equipment by visiting the City of Melville Civic Centre, 10 Almondbury Road, Booragoon.

Submission of comments closes for Attadale North on Friday, 25 November 2011 and for Ardross West on Friday, 2 December 2011.

Western Power and the City of Melville will consult with residents who provide comments before confirming the final equipment locations.

Attadale North boundaries are Stock Road, Burke Drive, Hislop Road and Wichmann Road. Project works scheduled to begin in April 2012.

Making Way for the Future

You can expect to see changes to the landscape at a number of sites across the City of Melville as seven unused buildings are being demolished to make way for community benefit.

The buildings have been approved for demolition for a number of reasons which include poor condition, asbestos removal, the purpose of the building restricts wider community use and to deter anti-social behaviour.

The buildings set for demolition from December are the former:

- Carawatha school buildings
- Mt Pleasant Pre Primary School
- Palmyra Scout Hall in Waddell Road
- Child Health Centre – the 'Rener Health' Building at the corner of Stock Road and Canning Highway
- Ardross Child Health Centre
- Applecross Pre Primary School
- St Michael's Terrace Child Health Centre in Mt Pleasant

The vacant land will either be developed into public open space or eventually sold to assist with the development of other community facilities.
