Key Actions Report: 2023 - 2024

Introduction

- This report is all about what we did during July 2023 June 2024. It doesn't include everything, but these are some of the things we wanted to celebrate or highlight. It also is a chance for you, as a young person to hold us accountable to what we have and haven't done so if you have questions or feedback please reach out! More on that later.
- Actions in this report means things that we planned to do in our <u>Directions From Young People (DFYP) 2022-</u> <u>2025 Youth Strategy</u>. The DFYP includes actions for every year of the 4 year plan and this report is for Year 2, 2023-2024.
- The DFYP was created with young people and is about what is important to them and how we can work with them. The strategy also includes information about the overall population of young people in our City. If you want to read the full DFYP, head on over to our website.
- The DFYP includes four action areas which are divided up by theme. They themes are Youth Focus, Wellbeing, Communication and Making a Difference.

Priority Actions

- The priority actions are our most important and sit separately to the 4 action areas. Other actions follow on from these.
- The DFYP 2022 2025 has four priority actions which you can read about below.

 For us, Youth Focus means making sure young people feel invited and included in the community life (eg. arts, libraries, venues, parks, gyms, participation in events, involvement in youth projects and facilities) of the City.

Youth Focus

Wilgi Kaartidjin Mia Willagee Library

In a major milestone for the City of Melville, the refurbished Willagee Library has been renamed to become the City's first dual named library.

Following work completed through the Place Names Melville Project, the library is now known as Wilgi Kaartdijin Mia Willagee Library meaning Willagee Knowledge Home.

The renovations include new facilities such as a dedicated youth space, improved air conditioning, and more spaces for study, activities and youth programs.

The youth space was designed with local young people and the First Nations Youth Drop In program.



Wellbeing

 This focus area is about actions that support the overall mental and physical wellbeing of young people.

AYCC Schools Climate Summit

In May 2024 the Australian Youth Climate Coalition ran their Schools Climate Summit at Piney Lakes Environmental Education Centre. AYCC and the United Nations Youth team brought together 90 students from 8 different schools for a full day of interactive workshops and activities. Workshops ranged from fundamentals of climate science, climate justice, youth leadership and civic engagement in democracy.

The event was funded by the City's Youth Project Fund and the venue was provided free of charge, thanks to the Piney Lakes Environmental Centre team!




Communication

Melville Youth Collective

We launched our Youth Instagram account @MelvilleYouthCollective in September 2023. The account aims to promote everything we do with young people here at the City, including events, community engagements, volunteering, paid opportunities and more. The brand name and design materials were created by the Youth Steering Group. Our posts almost always include young people or their artworks, including videos, posters and designs done by young locals.

In the first 9 months the account gained over 370 followers, and has grown to over 470 before the end of 2024!
