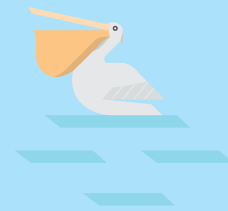

Long before there were bridges and roads, the location where Canning Bridge now sits was called Wagoorjup by the Noongar people. It is the place of the Waagyl – the great Rainbow Serpent!

When you stand by the river and see the sunlight dancing on the water, you can even imagine the Rainbow Serpent still gliding beneath the surface, looking after the Wagoorjup place.

The City of Melville is so happy to have you here in Canning Bridge, ready to embark on a new fun adventure.

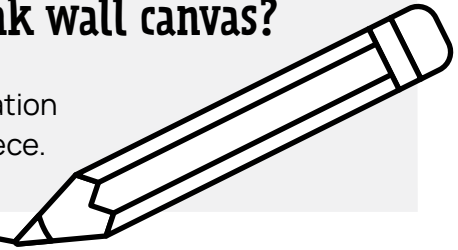




DESIGN YOUR OWN MURAL

Choose your theme

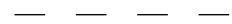

Lines help make shapes and guide your eyes. They can look so different! Try using lots of different lines in your design. Can you combine them into fun patterns?



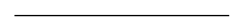

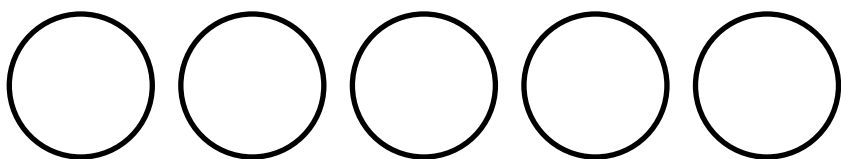
Color theory is like a secret code for picking colors that look great together!

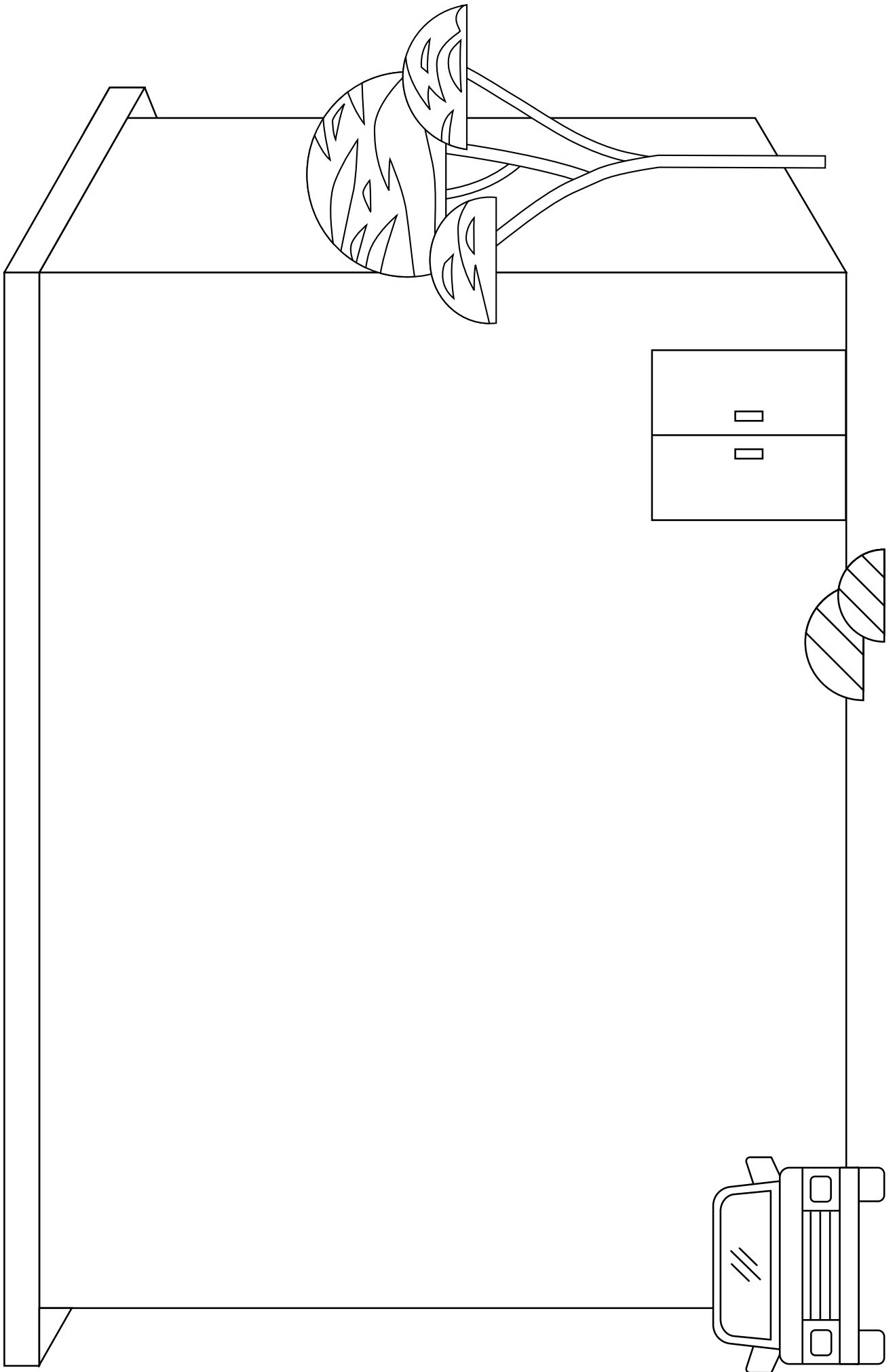
Analogous colors are buddies, like red, orange, and yellow.
