


# Local Learning for a Sustainable Future: A Directory of Resources for Teachers and Educators

# For Educators

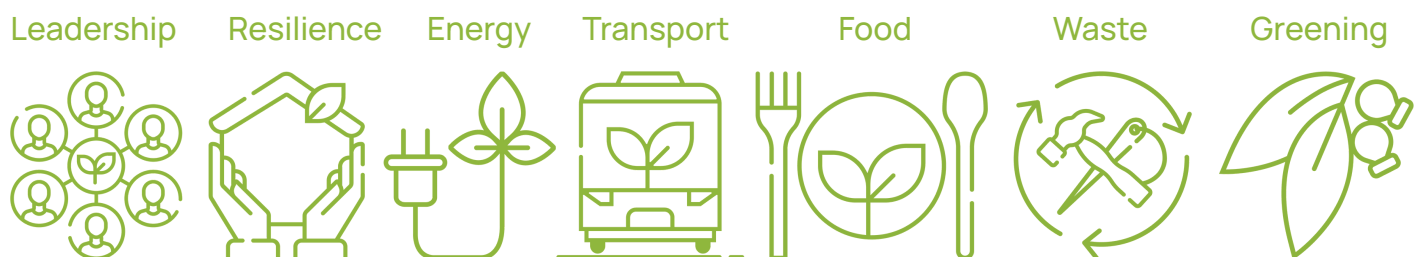
This resource has been developed by the City of Melville EcoHub to support local educators to embed learning and action for climate, biodiversity, and waste management into their education spaces.

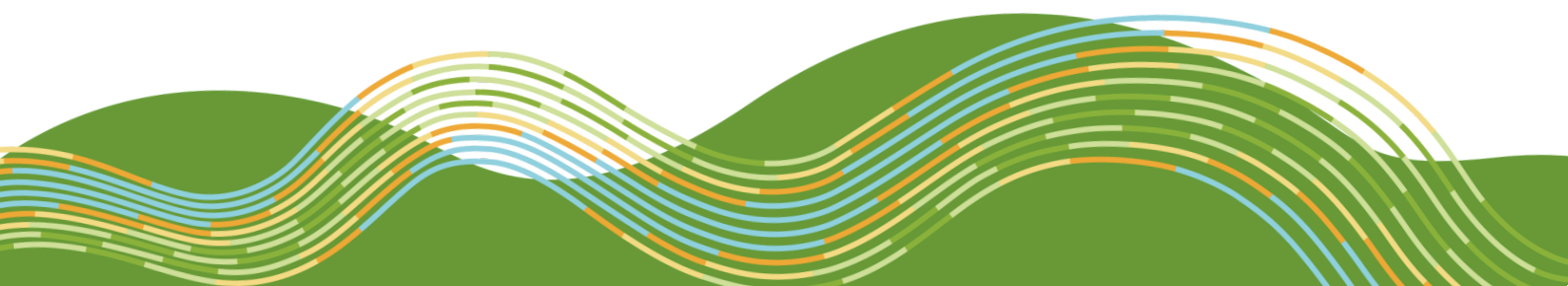

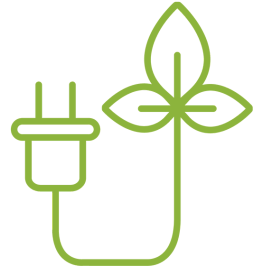
