

Melville's Slightly Cryptic Cycle Hunt

Terms and Conditions

1. The 2020 Bike Month Slightly Cryptic Cycle Hunt competition is open to residents of the City of Melville. Proof of residency may be requested from the winning entrants.
2. Entry into the competition signifies acceptance of these terms and conditions.
3. Instructions on how to enter the competition as well as information contained within promotional material form part of these terms and conditions.
4. Entry to the competition requires answering several questions from each stage on the trail. Entrants may (but do not have to) complete one, two or three stages for one entry per stage. A further entry into a photo competition will be given to those who submit a photo of their ride in the quiz form. One entry per family. Late entries will not be considered.
5. The competition runs from 9.00am on Thursday, 1 October and closes 9.00am on Monday, 2 November 2020.
6. Minor prize winners may be contacted throughout the month. Two major winners will be randomly drawn and two photo competition winners will be selected at the discretion of City staff on Friday, 6 November and notified via email to make arrangements for prize collection. A photo of the winner may be requested by the City for promotional use. The City reserves the right to select an alternative winner should they be unable to contact a winning entrant.
 1. All people within the photo must consent to the photo submission.
 2. Photographs should not show any inappropriate behaviour. Photos will be deemed eligible at the discretion of the City.
7. The winning entrants shall receive one of the following:
 - \$100 voucher for the overall winner
 - \$100 voucher for most creative photograph
 - \$100 voucher for most fun photograph
 - \$10 voucher for other entries
 - Mystery Box for Kids
