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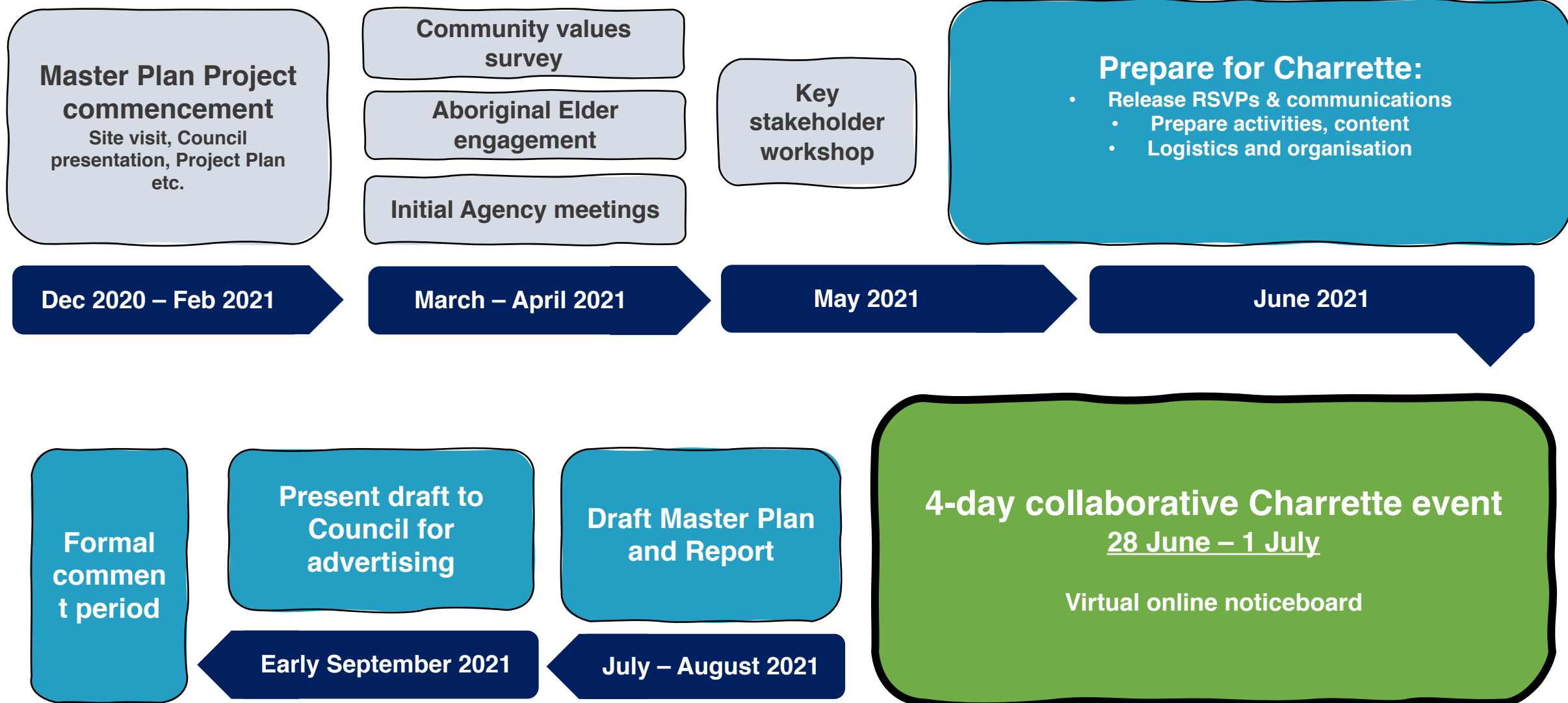

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## Aboriginal Engagement Process

- ✓ Elders First Approach

- ✓ Share concerns and discuss Noongar history for the area
- ✓ Develop the cultural narrative and themes for design team
- ✓ Consultants work with design team and relevant stakeholders

### Monitoring for Ground Disturbing work

- ✓ Heritage Panel – provide list of names for consultants

### Interim Heritage Panel

- ✓ Provide names for heritage surveys & monitoring to proponents

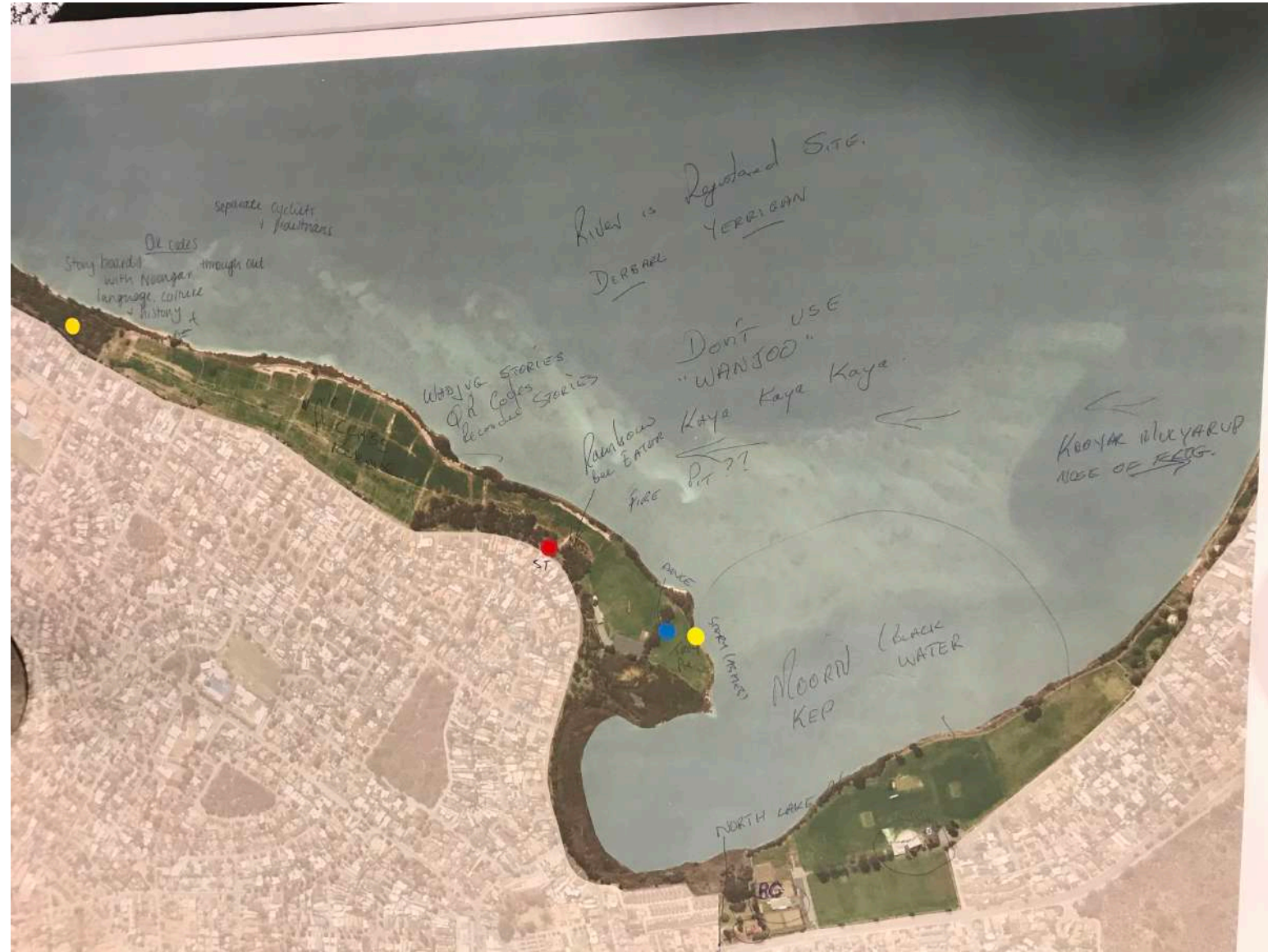




# Whadjuk Noongar Values

- **Noongar Language**



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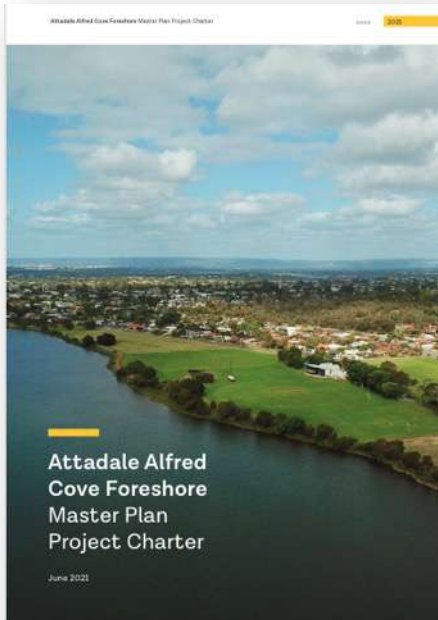

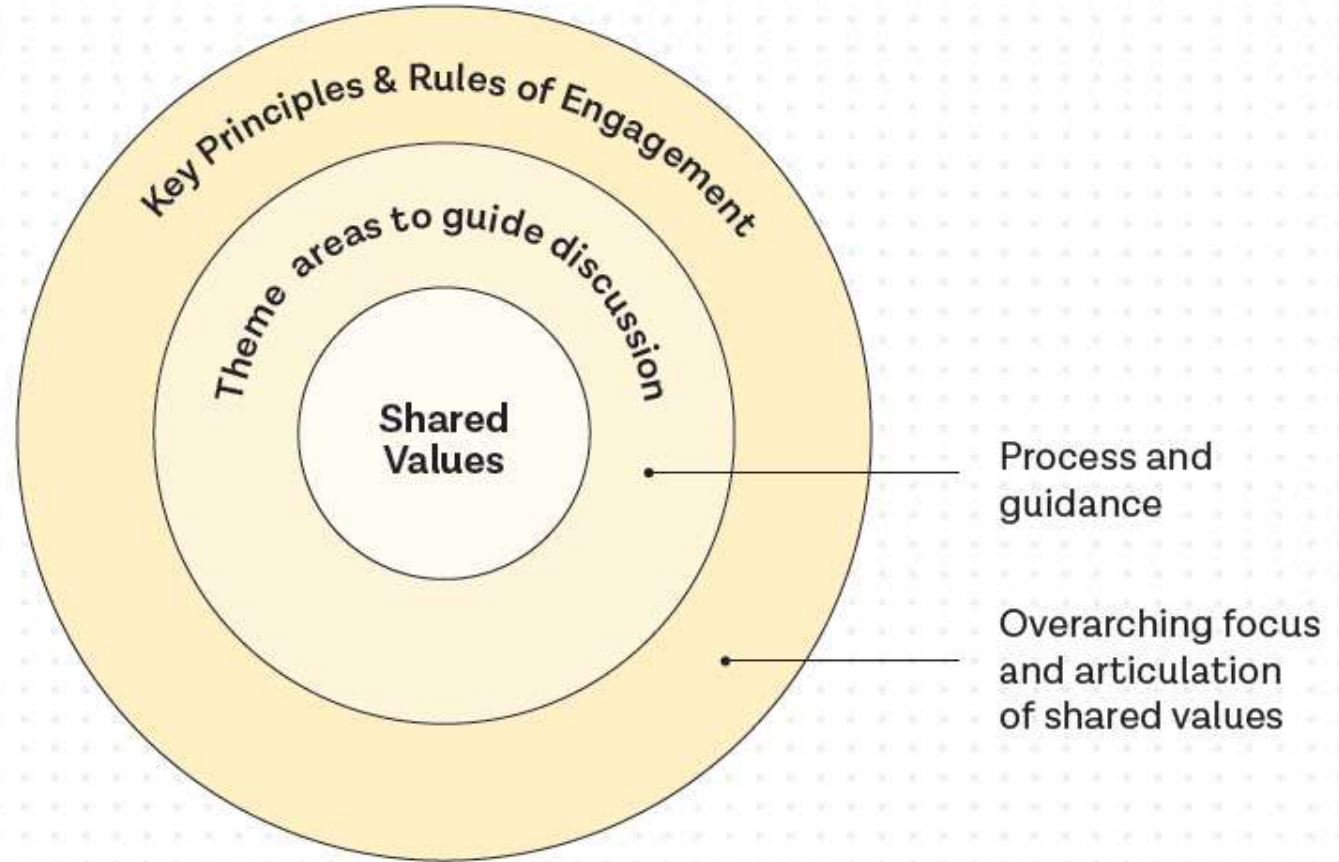

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## Our Beautiful Foreshore

### Preserving the Beauty

Our Foreshore, and the Bull Creek catchment that drains into it, are important parts of our natural heritage. There are many threats to the health and wellbeing of this area.

The water quality is affected by the things that we do in the catchment.

Our River foreshore requires good quality, healthy vegetation. Trees help protect banks from erosion by binding the soil, but unfortunately many have been lost over time. Damage to sedge beds through human activities also causes bank destabilisation. The resultant habitat loss affects native animals that live in the area.

The City of Melville works closely with local residents and businesses to protect and improve these areas. We have...
