












The Master Plan: 20-year outlook

- Long-term strategic document and vision for the area
- Overarching guidance and coordination for growth, development or maintenance
- Framework, key principles, shared values to assist future planning or decision-making
- Good practice, aspirations, intended outcomes
- Recommendations around future management, enhancement and investment

- Doesn't override or change existing statutory processes or protections
- Doesn't determine or make decisions on proposals themselves
- Not a statutory document



Aboriginal Engagement Process

- ✓ Elders First Approach
- ✓ Right People Right Place
- ✓ Whadjuk Aboriginal Reference Group
- ✓ Share concerns and discuss Noongar history for the area
- ✓ Develop the cultural narrative and themes for design team
- ✓ Consultants work with design team and relevant stakeholders

Noongar Native Title Settlement in Progress Transitioning

SWALSC – Role & Process

Heritage surveys

- ✓ Activity Notice from proponents
- ✓ Proponents are parties who have entered into a NSHA with SWALSC and agree to conduct a heritage survey
- ✓ Heritage Panel provide list of names for consultants

Monitoring for Ground Disturbing work

✓ Heritage Panel – provide list of names for consultants

Interim Heritage Panel

✓ Provide names for heritage surveys & monitoring to proponents





















Whadjuk Noongar Values

- **Noongar Language**






















