Workshop Purpose

To involve residents in thinking about and identifying their preferences for the 'fit out' of the public open space in the park and to identify any issues, concerns or ideas to be considered during construction.

Engagement opportunities for participants

- To be informed about project personnel, detail, tasks and timelines
- To see community input using the social map
- To identify ideas and preferred options with architects and artists working on the project using PollEverywhere

Engagement Tool

To obtain individual, unfiltered inputs from participants which could be viewed by everyone present, questions using various display formats were uploaded onto PollEverywhere. People who opted out of this process were able to write down their responses and submit them later.

Display formats for the open questions included word clouds, text walls and text blocks. Closed questions were put to the audience which included a 'clickable' image selection, a donut chart and column charts.


It should be noted that all text responses supplied have not been edited and are shown in their original form.


31 local residents were in attendance.




Years of birth to identify the generations represented were shown as follows.

Architects presentation and resident feedback





Artists' presentation and resident feedback

The artists described their approach to creating art and identified how residents could help in that process. They had three main questions to put to residents.

Conceptual Approach & Overview

Our approach for the creation of artworks for the Shirley Strickland Reserve are grounded in the landscape, linking these concepts to the role that the late Shirley Strickland de la Hunty played in the environmental conservation movement in Western Australia.

We propose to develop a narrative around the flora, inspired by the form, shape and colour of seed pods from the site as a means to create artworks that reflect a sense of place by creating an interface between Landscape, Heritage and History.



The artworks follow a narrative, an **imaginary line** that weaves through the Reserve. In this context, we are keen to investigate how this narrative embedded within the landscape celebrates the late Shirley Strickland de la Hunty legacy to the conservation movement in Western Australia.

The proposed location of the sculptural artworks around the fitness paths on one hand highlight Shirley Strickland's track and field achievements, but also to bring to the forefront people's connection to the site through the integrated textual artworks.



- Could you possibly look at having windows overlooking the oval behind the rooms


- B.Remeber please that if you try and please everyone it could end up a "dog's breakfast" so to say...




PollEverywhere was used to answer two closed questions and one open question. Responses are shown below.
