

# Proposed CCTV Rebate Program

## ENGAGEMENT SNAPSHOT



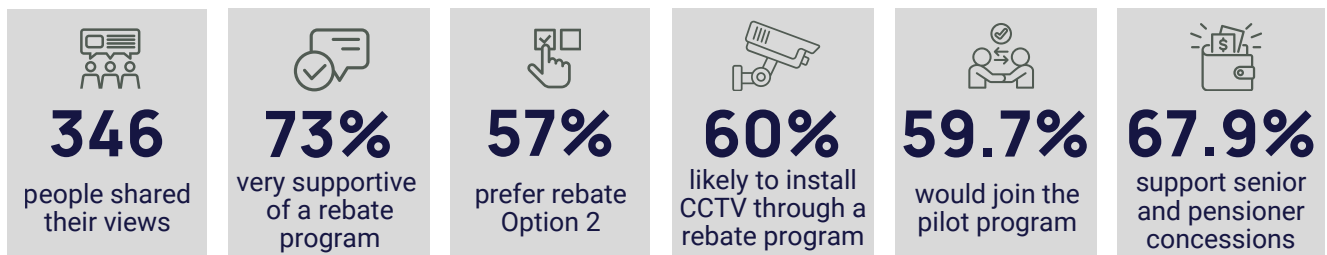
The City sought community feedback on a proposed CCTV Rebate Program to support community safety initiatives. Community safety is a shared priority for the City of Melville and a key focus under the Council Plan 2024–2034, which aims to build a safe, healthy and inclusive community. We are exploring new ways to support residents and enhance public spaces through technology and practical measures that help prevent crime and strengthen feelings of safety.

Consultation was held from **6 November to 14 December 2025**, inviting residents to comment on three potential rebate approaches:

- Option 1: An unmanaged rebate (\$200) for eligible CCTV installations.
- Option 2: A managed rebate (\$500) with basic technical standards and registration requirements.
- Option 3: A managed rebate paired with an opt-in pilot program in selected areas, with rebates of \$200 or \$500 depending on participation level.

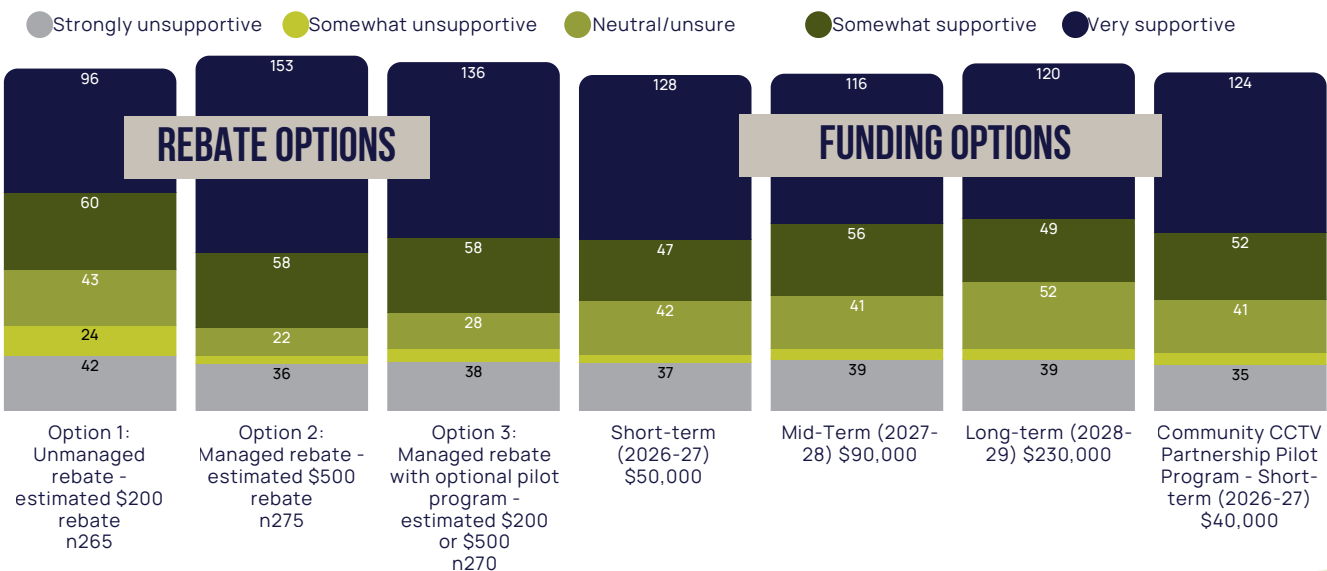
The community was informed through direct emails, social media, advertising, letters to residents, and a dedicated Melville Talks project page where full details and FAQs were provided.

## Results



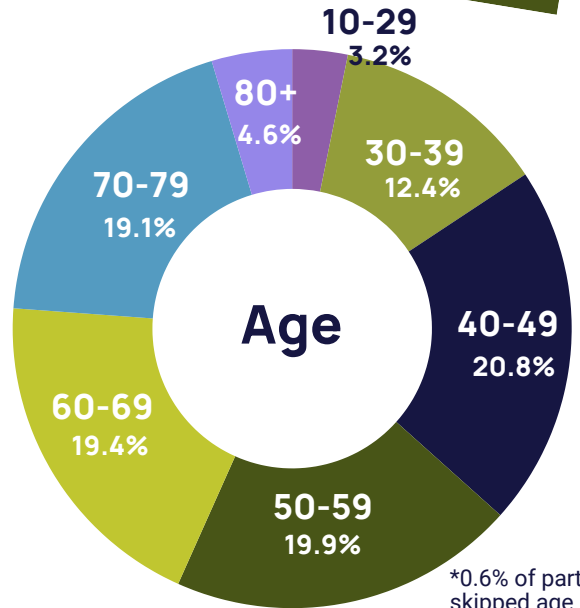
\*Between 81-83% of submissions responded to questions the above.

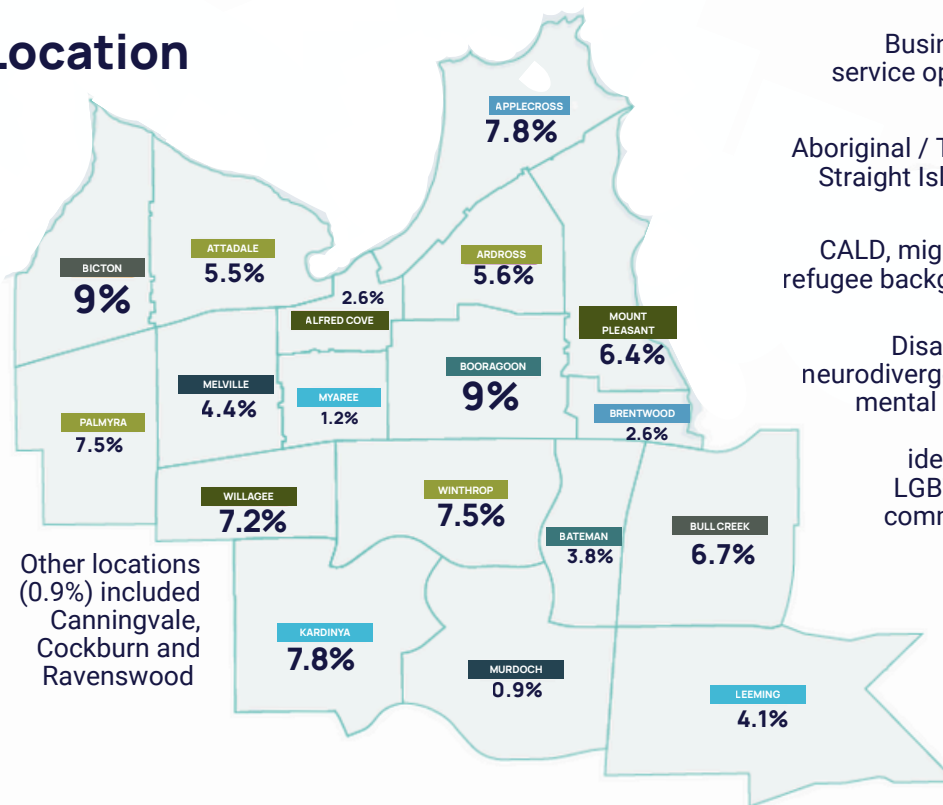
