I respectfully bring to the attention of Elected Members that a Special Meeting of the Electors will be held in the Kambarang (Conference), Melville Civic Centre, 10 Almondbury Road, Booragoon on Tuesday, 23 June 2026 commencing at 6:00pm.

The Special Meeting is for the purpose for the purpose of considering the John Connell Cricket Pitch Project, including the following matters:

- The proposed clearing of approximately 209 mature native trees and 0.68 hectares of remnant native vegetation at John Connell Reserve.
- The absence of a clearly demonstrated strategic need for the proposed cricket pitch expansion.
- Reliance on potentially outdated cost estimates and the absence of secured external funding.
- Potential financial impacts on future rates, borrowings and capital works priorities.
- Insufficient assessment of alternative options that may avoid or substantially reduce environmental impacts.
- Concerns regarding governance processes, transparency and evidence-based decision making.

Executive	<i>The substantial direction setting and oversight role of the Council. e.g. adopting plans and reports, accepting tenders, directing operations, setting and amending budgets.</i>
Legislative	<i>Includes adopting local laws, town planning schemes & policies.</i>
Review	<i>When the Council operates as a review authority on decisions made by Officers for appeal purposes.</i>
Quasi-Judicial	<i>When the Council determines an application/matter that directly affects a person's right and interests. The judicial character arises from the obligation to abide by the principles of natural justice. Examples of Quasi-Judicial authority include town planning applications, building licences, applications for other permits/licences (eg under Health Act, Dog Act or Local Laws) and other decisions that may be appealable to the State Administrative Tribunal.</i>

In accordance with the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*, the Presiding Member is to determine the procedure to be followed and will give regard to the *City of Melville Local Government (Meeting Procedures) Local Law 2022*.

1. In the event of an emergency, everyone should take direction from officers who will guide you to the exit points of the building.
2. Toilets are located immediately before the entry to the Council Chambers.
3. All present are required to sign the attendance register at the entry to the meeting.
4. Each person who participates in a vote or speaks must be an Elector of the City of Melville. Non-electors may only observe the proceedings.
5. The proceedings are being recorded for the purpose of production of the Minutes and speakers are requested to use the microphones each time they speak. The Minutes will include a summary of any questions asked and a summary of the responses provided.
6. Speakers are asked to clearly give their name and address each time they speak and are required to address the Chair of the meeting.
7. Only Electors of the City of Melville may move or second a motion. Motions are to be submitted in writing prior to the commencement of the meeting.
8. All addresses are to be limited to a maximum of five (5) minutes. Extension of time is permissible only with the agreement of a simple majority of Electors present (*Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996 Regulation 17*).
9. To ensure the efficient conduct of the meeting, please participate in a concise and respectful manner.
10. All Elected Members and officers who attend this meeting are there to observe the proceedings and hear comments from Electors. All questions and comments should be directed to the Mayor who may invite a response from the Chief Executive Officer, Presiding Members of Committees or Elected Members.

Requests that the Council resolves to pause any work being undertaken on the current John Connell Reserve Field Extension project and requests:

- a) further, comprehensive community consultation; and
- b) a review of the Business Case

The renewed consultation and analysis should be undertaken with a level of rigour consistent with projects of a similar scale and investment value (approximately \$4.7 million) and ensure that broader community expectations, project scope, financial implications, and potential impacts are fully understood and re-considered with a report to Council to consider before progressing the project.

6.1.2 Mr J Meotti, Leeming – Reactivate John Connell Oval Master Plan

That Council reactivate the John Connell Reserve Master Plan and undertake comprehensive community consultation to inform an assessment of all available options for the entire 47-hectare John Connell precinct, including both the existing cleared footprint and the former landfill site. This assessment should include the feasibility of options, including staged development if necessary, and ensure that the site's full redevelopment potential and wider community use are preserved and properly considered before any further decisions are made.

OFFICIAL**6.1.3 Mr J Meotti, Leeming – Remove Budget Expense John Connell Reserve Playing Field Extension**

The residents and ratepayers of the City of Melville request the Mayor and Council to delete the \$200,000 expense included in the 2026/27 Budget for expenditure on the John Connell Reserve Playing Field Extension Proposal, Leeming or any associated matter.

Reasons:

1. The proposed expenditure of \$200,000 will commit the City to over \$4 million in expenditure for future years with no guarantee that the overall expense will not exceed \$4 Million.
2. This year ratepayers are facing significant increases in rates, with average rates increases of over 6.7% to over 13% during a cost-of-living crisis, GRV increases, increased fuel prices and consequential increased food and living costs.
3. All of the above expenditure places an additional burden on ratepayers in this and future years.
4. There is no certainty that the approx. \$4,700,000 project will progress in the 2027/28 financial year, so imposing this cost on ratepayers in the 26/27 FY is unreasonable and unnecessary.
