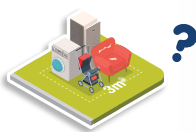
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Verge collection FAQs



Why can't I see any dates to book?

Make sure you've first entered your address in the booking form. Then check for dates further in the future (we visit each area every two weeks).

What time of year is best to book a collection?

Between March and September will have the most available dates. October to February tends to fill up quick.

Do you provide a skip bin?

No. Place waste directly onto the verge in separate, neat piles. Separate mattresses, white goods, e-waste and general bulky waste.

Which items are NOT accepted?

Please **DO NOT** place these out:

- × Batteries (see page 10)
- × Glass items that could shatter
- × Bean bags
- × Car parts or tyres
- × Hazardous waste (see page 10)

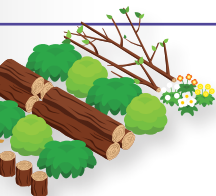
Which items ARE accepted?

- ✓ Furniture, carpet and linoleum
- ✓ Toys & bicycles
- ✓ Fencing material (wood, steel)
- ✓ Bulk cardboard
- ✓ BBQs (no gas bottles)

Book your verge collections before the end of year rush!

You are eligible for:



2 X Garden organics verge collections

Three (3) cubic metres per collection.

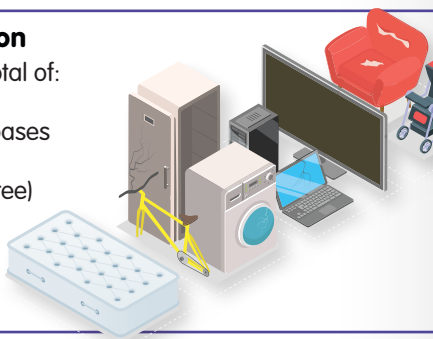
Log width no greater than 350mm in diameter. Cut ends should face the road.

1 X Bulk verge collection

Three (3) cubic metres in total of:

- Bulk items
- Mattresses and bed bases (up to three)
- White goods (up to three)
- E-waste

Please separate piles neatly by category.



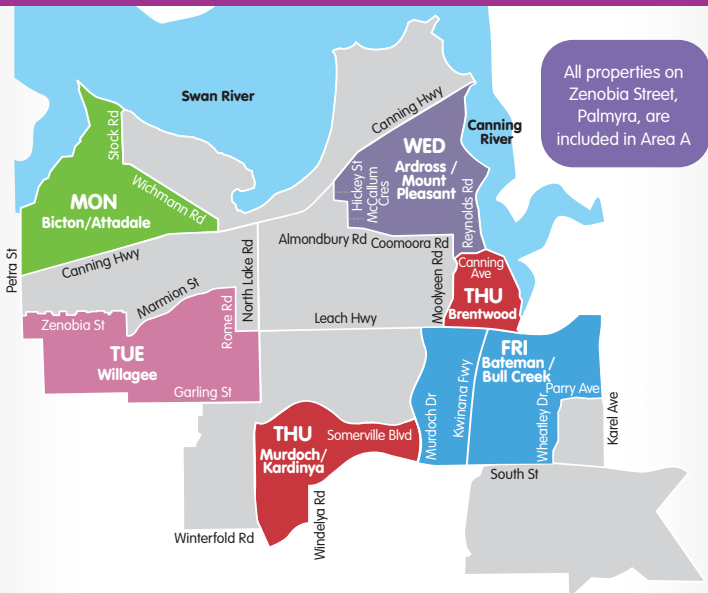
Please note: Multi-unit dwellings (units / apartments) should speak to their strata to organise a group collection.

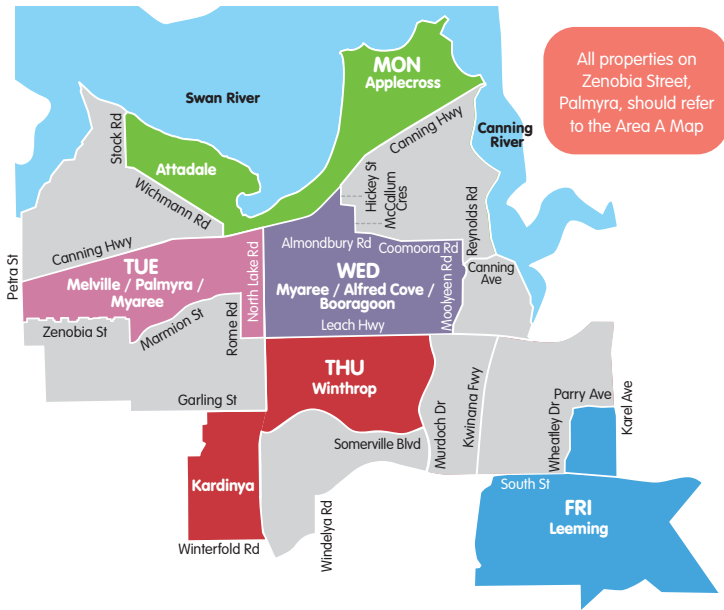
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Christmas & New Year's day public holidays

Christmas day and New Year's day are the only two days of the year that we do not collect bins. If your bin day falls on the Friday, 25 December 2026 and Friday, 1 January 2027 public holiday, leave it out for collection on Saturday, 26 December 2026 and Saturday, 2 January 2027.

**'COMPOSTABLE' CUPS AND PACKAGING
SHOULD GO IN YOUR *GENERAL WASTE***

Many contain per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) - a 'forever' chemical that is bad for compost.

Also, FOGO processing equipment cannot distinguish between compostable and non-compostable materials.

PAPER

Clean and not shredded.



CARDBOARD

Flattened and clean.



GLASS BOTTLES AND JARS

Rinsed and lids removed.
Broken glass is accepted.



PLASTIC BOTTLES AND CONTAINERS

Rinsed and lids removed.



CANS

Steel and aluminium.



NO SOFT PLASTICS



Soft plastics like plastic bags, scrunchable packets and cling wrap **cannot be recycled** through your yellow-lidded recycling bin.

NO COFFEE CUPS



Place soft plastics and coffee cups in your red-lidded general waste bin.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

Hazardous chemicals and materials must not go into any of your kerbside bins. You can drop these to one of 15 HHW facilities in WA for FREE*.

Examples of Items accepted through the HHW program include:

- Aerosols
- Batteries
- Fluorescent globes & tubes
- Gas bottles
- Household chemicals
- Paint
- Pesticides/herbicides
- Poisons/toxins



*Domestic waste only. Limit 20kg/20L per material type. See all details and a full list of HHW items and drop off locations at walga.asn.au/hhw

Phones and chargers (MobileMuster)



All brands and types of mobile phones, plus their batteries, chargers and accessories can be dropped off at most Optus, Vodafone and Telstra stores, as well as other select locations.

Batteries (B-cycle)

B-cycle drop-off points can be found at your local Coles, Woolworths, Aldi, Bunnings and other locations.

Collect them at home in a jar, tape the terminals (ends) and bring them to a drop-off point when you shop.
