Subject: Attadale Reserve (Attadale-Alfred Cove Foreshore Master Plan)

### PROPOSED NOTICE OF MOTION: CITY OF MELVILLE

**That the Council directs the Chief Executive Officer to ensure that during the Attadale-Alfred Cove Master Plan Design Refinement Process only the single existing Active Reserve (Troy Park) be retained in Attadale Reserve, deleting the sports ovals from the eastern end in the current draft plan.**

### REASONS:

1. If implemented, the twin ovals proposal would reduce the overall area for the current recreational use of Attadale Reserve by about one-half, which would have an adverse effect on its current passive recreational use.
2. Even without these ovals, the Active Reserve Infrastructure Strategy (ARIS) report (May 2020) found that there are already parking issues associated with the location of Troy Park and the nature of Burke Drive, which serves the popular Point Walter recreational area and a major College, as well as local traffic.
3. There are issues associated with lighting, noise, and club infrastructure which are incompatible with the current passive recreational use of Attadale Reserve, affecting not only the users of the space but also the residents in the vicinity.
4. A charrette is intended as an intensive, multi-disciplinary workshop to develop a design, but is not primarily a consultation tool. The proposal for ovals was not included in all the Attadale-Alfred Cove Master Plan charrette sessions and as a result the process did not include broad community consultation, which would have revealed the high impact on local residents, who are only now becoming aware of it and using various alternative methods (petitions, social media, as well as protests to Local and State government members, and plans for Special Electors Meetings) to oppose it.
