Tablets vs eReaders

There are many devices people can use to read eBooks. Here is a comparison to decide whether a tablet or an eReader is more suitable for you.

Tablets

Tablets are multi-purpose devices such as the Apple iPad and Samsung Galaxy Tab. This might be a better option for an occasional reader.

- Read with downloaded apps such as Libby
- Can be used for more than reading
- Can be expensive
- Screen can be glaring
- Device may be heavier
- Shorter battery life

eReaders

eReaders, such as the Kobo, are specifically designed to read eBooks. This might be a better option for an avid reader.

- Matte paper-like screen
- Lightweight & comfortable for holding
- Long battery life
- Store thousands of books
- Primarily built for reading
- No downloadable apps
- Black & white only display in most models

eReaders

Search, browse and read digital books

Not all eReaders are compatible with the library

The two popular brands of eReaders today are Kindle and Kobo. At present, only Kobo eReaders are compatible with the Melville Libraries eResources collection.

- Many newer Kobo models include built-in OverDrive support, which lets you borrow eBooks from **Libby** directly on your Kobo eReader.
- Sometimes, they will require a separate software called **Adobe Digital Editions (ADE)** on a computer to transfer borrowed items.
- Kindle eReaders are *not able* to access content from Melville Libraries



Adobe Digital Editions (ADE)

ADE is a free downloadable software used to manage digital publications such as eBooks and eMagazines.

Use Libby/OverDrive with Kobo

To borrow on Libby eBooks on your Kobo, sign in to your OverDrive* account. On your **Home screen**, tap **More > Settings > OverDrive > Search “City of Melville”**. Log in with your library card number and PIN number.

*OverDrive gives you access to the same collection as Libby but eBooks not compatible with Kobo will not appear. eAudiobooks and eMagazines are not supported in the built-in OverDrive function on the Kobo.

Start reading digitally

Download eBooks onto your eReaders

Download Adobe Digital Editions (ADE)

You will need ADE:

- If you have an ADE compatible eReader
- If the OverDrive feature is not available in your Kobo
- You would like to read eBooks on BorrowBox & ePlatform

Step 1: Download ADE

Click [here](#) to download Adobe Digital Editions 4.5.12 software.

Once downloaded, open and install. Follow prompts in the setup wizard. If prompted, leave all file types selected.

Step 2: Authorise your computer

Click [Help > Authorize](#) Computer in the top bar. You will need to set up an Adobe ID if you do not have one. Click [Create an Adobe ID](#).

Enter your Adobe ID and password in ADE, then click [Authorize](#).

Step 3: Authorise your eReader

Turn on your eReader and connect it to your computer. You may need to click Connect or Allow on your eReader display. Once connected, your eReader should appear in ADE on the left bar under [Devices](#).


- Right-click on your eReader and select [Authorize Device](#).
- In the pop-up screen, select your Adobe ID and click [Authorize Device](#).

Step 4: Find something to read


 Visit the [Melville Libraries Catalogue](#) for eBooks to read.



Search, browse and discover the catalogue. When you have found an eBook to borrow, check **Vendor** to see where it is located.

To proceed, select the item and click Download. You may have to place a hold if the item is not available.

If you have chosen a  **BorrowBox** item:

- You will be directed to the BorrowBox website. Click Download for eReader (Adobe ePub).

If you have chosen an  **ePlatform** item:

- You will be given format options. Select EBook (Adobe Digital Editions), and click Check Out. Your download will begin automatically.
- If you have chosen a  **Libby** item:
 - You will be given format options. Select EBook (Adobe Digital Editions), and click Check Out.
 - If you have OverDrive/Libby on your Kobo, sync your eReader and the item will appear in your device library.
 - If not, click here to log in to your Libby account.
 - On  , click Manage Loan > Read With... > EPUB

Step 5: Transfer downloaded eBook onto your eReader

Once your books have finished downloading, click to open them. They will automatically open and store in your ADE Library.

To transfer your items, make sure your eReader is plugged into your computer.

- To view all your eBooks in ADE, click All Items.
- Click on the item you wish to transfer, drag and drop it in your eReader (located in your left menu).
- Unplug your eReader and let it take a moment to sync.
- Enjoy your eBook!

Step 6: Return your eBook

Once you have finished your eBook, use Adobe Digital Editions to return it. Books opened with ADE must be returned there due to licensing issues.

- Click All Items in ADE.
- Right-click on the eBook you wish to return and select Return Borrowed Item. The book will then be returned and disappear.
- To remove or delete an eBook on your device without returning, right-click onto the item and select Remove from Library.

Tip

eBooks downloaded onto Adobe Digital Editions adheres to the same borrowing limits allowed by the lending platform. The item will no longer be able to open once it has expired.

FAQs

Frequently Asked Questions

I already have a Kindle. Why can't I use it to get library books?

Unfortunately, this has to do with licensing issues beyond our control. If you do not wish to purchase another eReader, you will be able to use an app on a tablet or smartphone.

Can I listen to eAudiobooks and read eMagazines on my eReader?

Some eReaders are able to store eAudiobooks but they may not have speakers. You will need a pair of bluetooth headphones to listen. eMagazines are similar to eBooks, however, only some eReaders are equipped with colour for better magazine reading experience.

Why do I need to authorise my computer and eReader with ADE?

You will need the authorisation to download and install Digital Rights Management (DRM) protected eBooks on ADE due to copyright license.

How many items can I get on my eReader?

This depends on the borrowing limits on each platform. More information can be found on our [eLibrary page](#).
