- Booragoon Lake Boardwalk

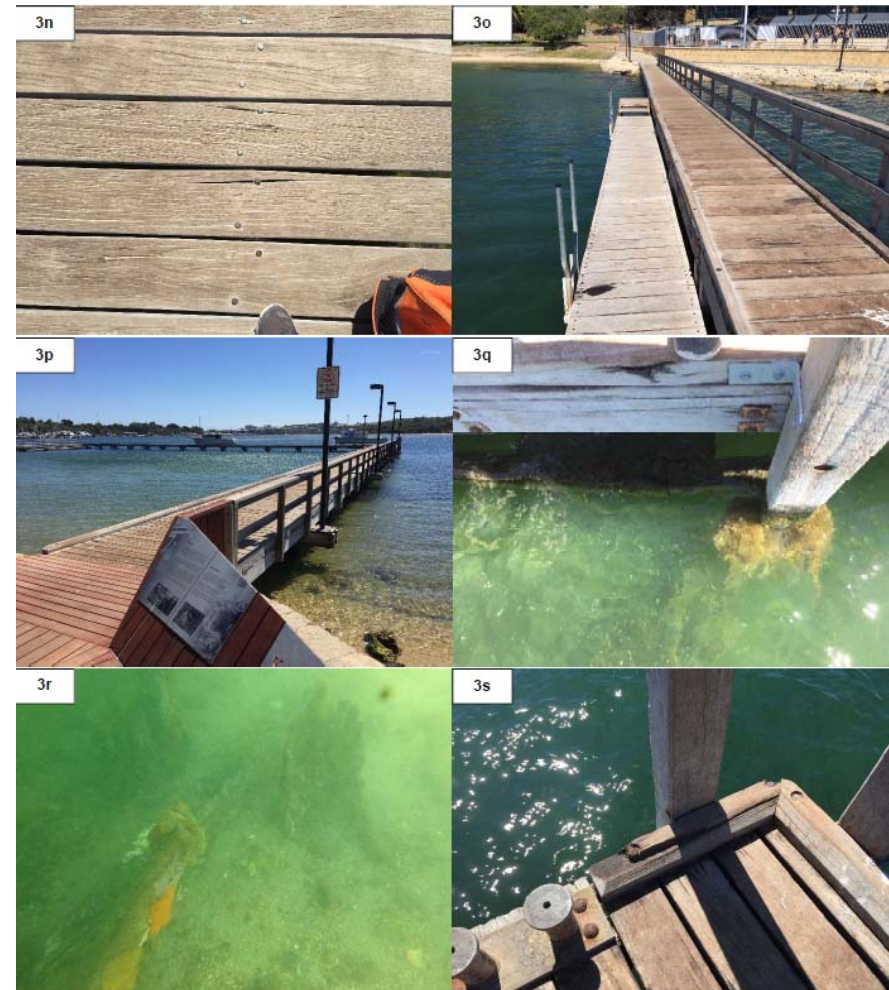
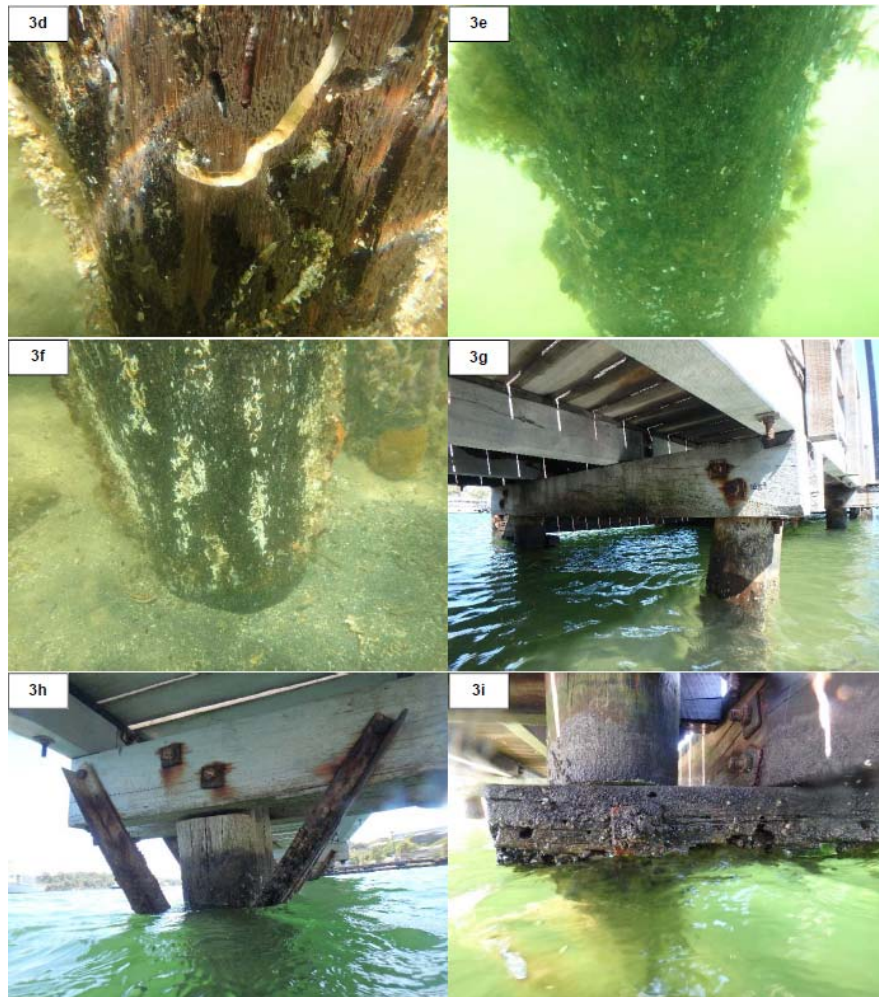

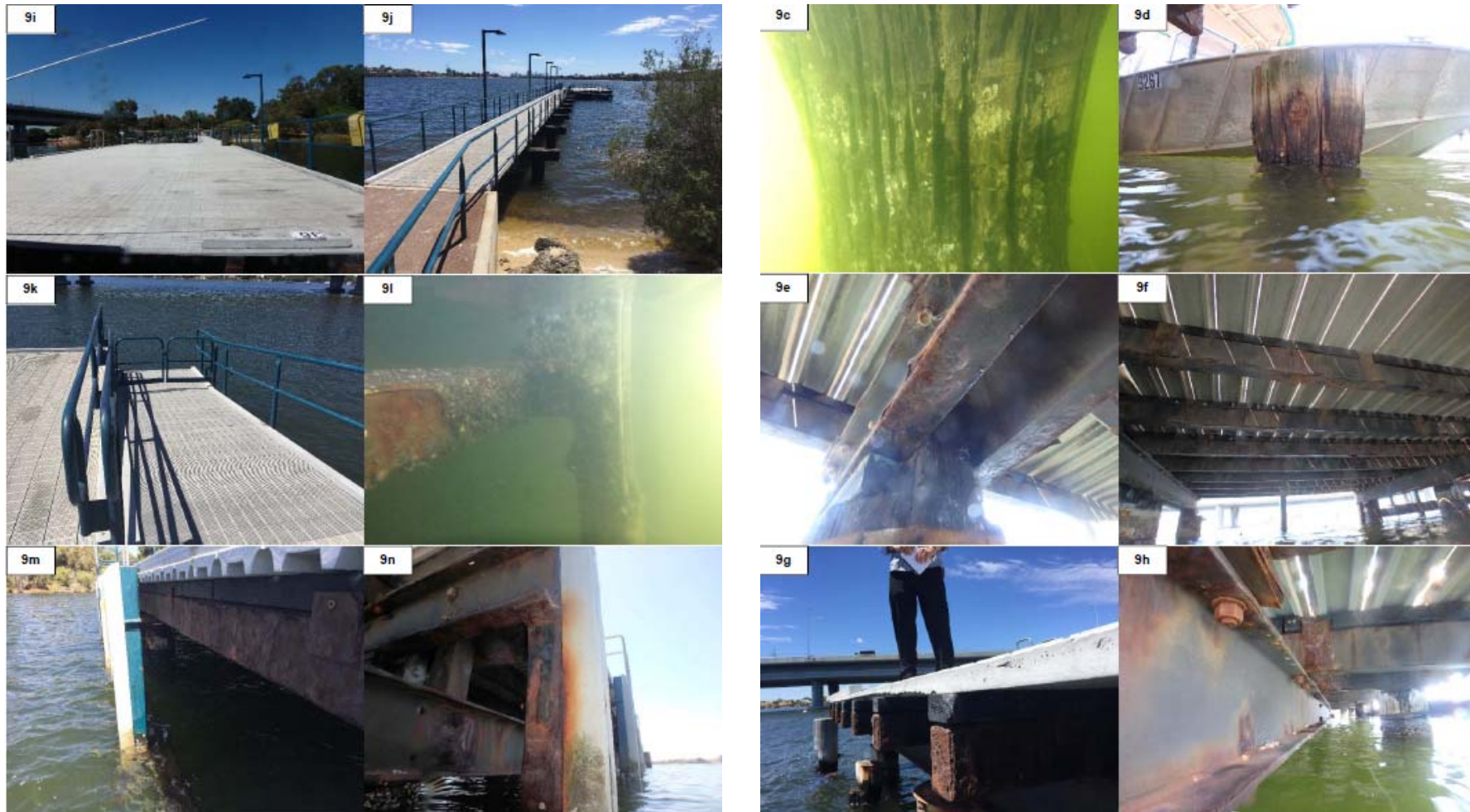
