POLICY OBJECTIVES

To provide guidance and direction to the City for the best practice waste management and the minimisation of domestic waste going to landfill, whilst also providing a value for money service to our residents.

POLICY SCOPE

To provide a statement on the City's position with regard to waste management and minimisation and a high level framework to guide the operations and the development of future strategies to achieve environmentally and socially responsible waste management and the diversion of waste from landfill through resource recovery.

POLICY STATEMENT

The City of Melville has committed to the reduction in the volume of domestic waste being placed in landfill and over the last decade has achieved the previous in accordance with State Government Waste Strategy target of 65% diversion of domestic waste from landfill by 2020. The State Government's Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery Strategy 2030 has established new targets for waste diversion from landfill, now termed material recovery targets, of 70% by 2025 and 75% by 2030. A significant strategy to help the City meet and seek to exceed this goal is the City's membership of, investment in and support of the SMRC and its' waste composting and material recovery programs, in which the City participates. In addition to the State Government target, the City seeks to continuously improve its performance on behalf of residents and ratepayers.

The City of Melville is committed to reducing our impacts on climate change by the development and support of recycling and resource recovery strategies in support of sustainable and responsible disposal of domestic waste.

The introduction of the ~~three~~ 3-bin Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO) system in 2017, as a trial, was followed by the full rollout of the FOGO 3-bin waste collection system in 2019 which places the City of Melville as one of the leading Local Governments in waste management throughout Western Australia.

The City ~~We~~ will comply with the following objectives:

- Conservation of and efficient use of resources.

- Providing safe and efficient waste management and disposal.
- Continually improve services to maximise material recovery and encourage active community participation in waste management
- Compliance with regulatory requirements.

Within our Operations, the City will:

- Recognise the needs of the community by providing best practiseadequate services for the removal and disposal of all domestic waste generated.
 - Work in partnership with the SMRC to provide targeted waste education programs and material for the City's residents.
 - Ensure all waste collected for disposal at landfill or processing at material recovery facilities is delivered to only properly constructed, engineered and environmentally managed landfill and processing sites in compliance with the Department of Water & Environment Regulation requirements.
 - Provide a cost effective diverse and sustainable waste collection service to encourage maximum participation in recycling and resource recovery.
 - Support a waste management hierarchy as follows:
 - Waste-Avoidance
 - Waste-Reduction
 - Waste-Recovery₁
 - Re-use
 - Reprocessing and
 - Re-use
 - Recycling
 - Energy Recovery
 - Waste Disposal
- Support the Circular Economy concept in our operations and waste management activities in the Community
- Support the local processing of recyclable material, in preference to offshore processing, and the establishment of local recycling industries and markets in the region
 - Constantly seek out innovative and new technologies to assist the Policy scope
