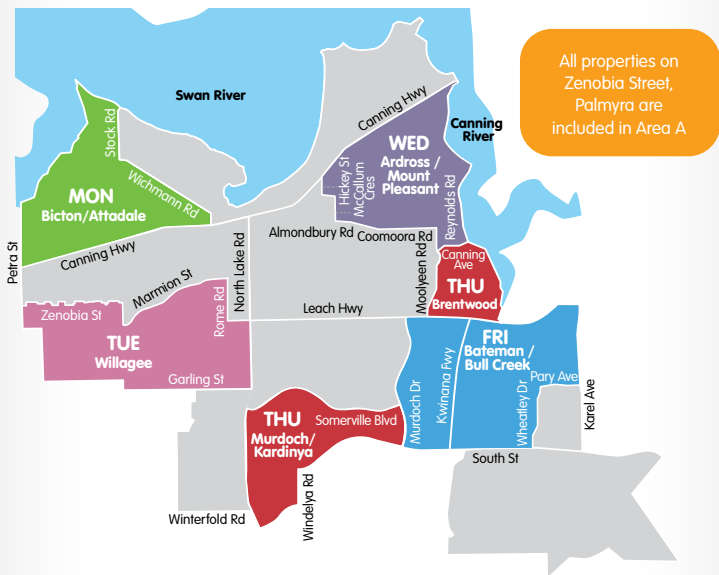

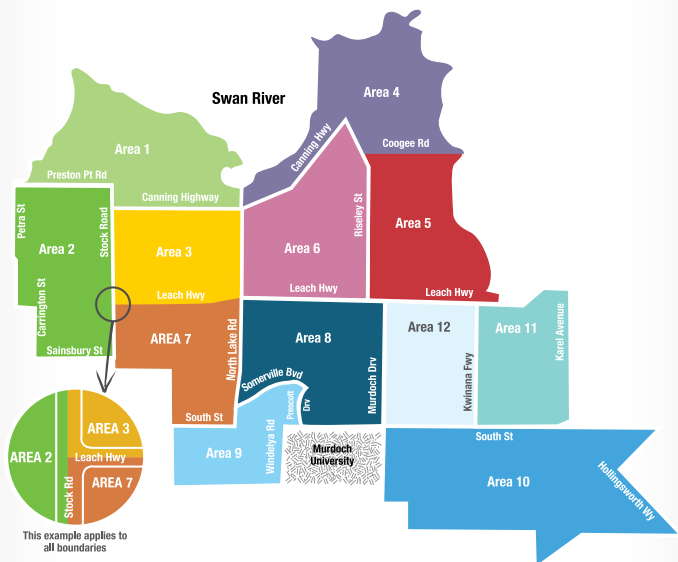

What will be collected

Tree and shrub prunings up to:

- ✓ 1.5 metres in length.
- ✓ 30cm in diameter.
- ✓ 2 cubic metres.

Garden organics can be placed on the verge up to 7 days prior to the collection start date.

What will not be collected

- × Boxes or bags of leaves and grass clippings.
- × Dug out lawn, sand and soil.
- × Long branches (over 1.5m).
- × Garden chemicals, garden pots and reticulation.
- × General waste.
- × Treated timber.
- × Garden organics placed near services, reticulation, walls or structures.
- × Garden organics on vacant land and public reserves.

Please inspect all garden organics prior to disposal, if you see signs of borer, keep the garden organics at your property and contact DPIRD on **(08) 9368 3080**.

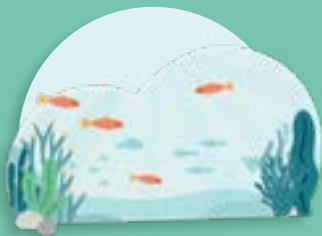

Sort waste into 3 separate piles to help us recycle.



Please do

- ✓ Place waste neatly on your verge by 6am.
- ✓ Allow 7 working days for collection.
- ✓ Keep checking your pile to ensure compliance.
- ✓ Secure items if strong winds or severe weather is forecast.

Please don't

- × Place your bulk waste on any other verge, vacant land or public reserves – penalties apply for illegal dumping and it WILL NOT be collected.
- × Obstruct footpaths, driveways, bin services or line of sight for pedestrians, cyclists or cars.
- × Exceed the allowed volume of bulk waste (up to 2 cubic metres and items up to 1.5 metres in length).
- × Place items near services, reticulation, walls, letterboxes, trees, fences, vehicles or other structures.

What will not be collected

- × All building materials, bricks, paving, tiles, toilet cisterns, concrete, wire, sand and cement.
- × Asbestos and other fibrous cement products.
- × Garden and food waste.
- × Glass: mirrors, windows, furniture with glass panels, screens and fish tanks.
- × Tyres and motor vehicle parts.
- × Fire Extinguishers, EPIRBs and flares.
- × Hazardous waste: chemicals, oils, paint, pesticides, solvents, batteries, gas bottles and smoke detectors.
- × Items over 1.5 metres in length.
